

Pavilion Volunteer Application

Welcome to the Pavilion, we are so excited that you want to join with us in serving Jesus Christ our Lord. You are obeying his calling by wanting to help us in serving and hopefully leading others to the Lord.

The Pavilion is a ministry of the **Bridge Street House of Prayer** (BSHOP). The mission of the BSHOP is building a bridge between the streets and the church. Thus, the BSHOP works to point people to Jesus, help meet the physical needs of neighbors, as well as build a bridge between the streets and the church.

The **Vision** of the Pavilion is "Providing a place of safety and refuge on the West Side of Grand Rapids."

Our desire is that the Pavilion would not only be a resting place for the weary, but a launching pad into a new life. We want the Pavilion to be more than a landing-zone, but rather a bridge...a bridge from the streets of the West Side to full life in Jesus.

As a volunteer staff, our desire is to maintain a safe and peaceful environment where customers and volunteers are able to use their gifts and abilities, customers receive respectful service, and the mission and vision of the Pavilion is upheld.

Therefore, the main responsibilities in the coffee shop are as follows:

Loving people (based on Matthew 19:19)

Serving beverages and baked goods

Praying (for one another, those at the Pavilion, or for the neighborhood/city)

General cleaning

All Volunteers are required to attend a **Training Orientation**, which will equip volunteers with information about BSHOP, provide biblical and applicable teachings, as well as include opportunities to build relationships with other volunteers. Training Orientations take place three to four times a year.

We also desire to facilitate unity and community among volunteers. Thus, we try to hold occasional **Volunteer meetings/events** as a time of fellowship among volunteers, as well as take time to discuss ways we can move forward and improve the ministry in the Pavilion. Your participation in these events is highly encouraged.

We ask that you pray about being involved here. This volunteer opportunity will require commitment. Please know that we ask that you treat this like a job. Therefore, maintained personal hygiene, timeliness, willingness to follow instructions, and respectful attitudes are expected.

I waive any right that I may have to inspect any information provided about me by any person or organization identified by me in this application.

Should my application be accepted, I agree to be bound by the constitution, statement of faith and abuse policies of the BSHOP, and to refrain from conduct unbecoming to Christ in the performance of my services on behalf of The Prayer House. If I violate these guidelines, I understand that my volunteer status may be terminated. By signing this application, I state that all of the information given about myself is true.
